IMAGE OF THE WEEK WHAT IS THIS A PICTURE OF?



"Who do you carry the torch for, my young man? Do you believe in anything? Or do you carry it around just to burn things down?"

These are the first few lines of one of my favorite songs, "The Archers' Bows Have Broken" by alternative punk band Brand New. Though they aren't considered a Christian band, much of Brand New's lyrical content focuses on the inward struggle of identifying with a higher power, especially on their third album, The Devil and God Are Raging Inside Me, on which the above lyrics are found.

I have kept these words in the back of my mind ever since I first heard the song. I love the symbolism that is used in these lyrics, which compare our beliefs to a flame. The fascinating thing about fire is that while it can give heat and sustain life, it can also cause devastation in the wrong circumstances.

The Gospel is the same way. When presented properly, it can bring life to the coldest hearts. However, if presented in a manner that condemns or puts down sinners, it can be harmful, driving unbelievers away from God and the church. Paul writes in the letter to the Colossians that we must "walk with wisdom towards outsiders, making the best use of the time." (4:4) We must not approach lost souls with disdain, but rather with grace, mercy and love. If we share the Gospel in this manner, then people will accept the truth more readily.

Therefore, carry your torch carefully. The Gospel is a precious truth. We must not use it to destroy souls, but instead we are called to give light and warmth to a cold, dark world.
